1. What is the International Technology Management Program?

The International Technology Management Program is designed for students those who are interested in studying technology management and Japanese business. Courses are taught in either English or Japanese so that students who do not have enough Japanese language ability can begin their studies by taking English courses. During the two year period of the master's course, students are expected to achieve a working level in Japanese with the help of Japanese language classes. Career support and advice are provided, as well as an opportunity for an internship at a Japanese company. A selected number of students will be awarded the Monbusho Shogakukin (Japanese Government Scholarship) for two years.
