Modality

A foreign faculty and an Indian faculty teach a one-week or two-week course together to students and industry participants from India.

- Drawing attention of world's best teachers and researchers to the opportunities and challenges in India.

Funding

One-week course

- In-person teaching USD 8,000 (₩ 11 Million)
- Online teaching USD 3,500 (₩ 4.8 Million)

Two-week course

- In-person teaching USD 12,000 (₩ 16.5 Million)
- Online teaching USD 6,500 (₩ 8.9 Million)

Covers

- travel,
- hospitality,
- honorarium to teachers,
- contingency expenses.

Submit a Proposal

- Contact a faculty in India.
- Find a niche area which is not typically NOT covered in university curriculum
- The host faculty will submit the proposal through their local GIAN coordinator.

Review of the proposal

- Couse is assigned a section (e.g., social sciences, physical sciences, etc.)
- The section committee chair assigns 3-4 reviewers.
- Reviewers send their review comments.
- Final recommendation is made by the sectional committee chair.
- Final approval is granted with the consent of the Ministry.

Conduct the course


- Advertise the course to attract participations from other colleges and industries in India.
- Organize the required number of lectures and tutorials/labs.
- Evaluate the course participants and give certificates.
- Webcast the lectures live, save all the teaching material and video lectures.





Past History

- The GIAN program started in 2015.
- Three phases of the program have been completed successfully. Fourth phase has recently started.
 - More than 1800 courses have been conducted
 - 19 courses were co-taught by South Korean faculty members.
 - There is a major potential for increasing Korea's participation.








Phase - IV
